How should industries respond to REACH and globally influential EU standards?

REACH is a European Community Regulation on chemicals and their safe use, entered into force on 1 June 2007, with the aim of improving the protection of human health and environment while enhancing innovative capability and competitiveness of the EU chemicals industry.

The REACH Regulation gives greater responsibility to industry to manage the risks from chemicals and to provide safety information on the substances. In this seminar, Ms Astrid Schomaker, Head of Chemical Unit at the Directorate-General for Environment of the European Commission, will present the recent developments in the EU concerning REACH and Mr Fumiaki Shoji, Vice-Secretary General for the REACH Taskforce at the Japan Chemical Industry Association, will present the impact of REACH and the global trends in chemical substances management and discuss how Japanese industries should respond.

During the seminar, Mr. Philippe Jean, Head of the Automotive Unit in the European Commission's Directorate-General for Enterprise & Industry, will present the European automotive policy and strategy for promoting job security in the sector and for providing green and affordable cars to consumers and Mr. Akira Matsunaga, Director of the Automotive Division of the Ministry of Economy, Trade & Industry, will explain how Japan sees the impact of the economic crisis on its automotive industry as well as METI's strategy for promoting the diffusion of next-generation cars to meet today's energy and environment challenges.

Industrial Policy Seminar Global Economic Activities and EU Merger Regulation: Legal and Economic Analyses

10 March 2009, Tokyo, Japan

The EU Merger Regulation was adopted in 1989 and took effect the following year. During its relatively short 20-year history, there has been a wide range of controversies, among other things with respect to judicial review by the European Court of Justice, the substantive test in the light of which mergers are reviewed, and the rules governing the methods and procedures for determining whether a given transaction is compatible with EU competition law, leading to a revision of the Regulation in 2004. The objective of merger review in the EU is to ensure that competition is maintained in the common market.

The objective of the seminar, co-organised by the Delegation of the European Commission to Japan and the EU-Japan Centre for Industrial Cooperation, was to examine how the EU merger review is conducted, how the "relevant market" is determined and what measures are likely to be taken in the event a transaction raises serious doubts as to its compatibility with EC competition law, with regard to those transactions on a global scale.

The EU-Japan Centre for Industrial Cooperation organised an Industrial Policy Seminar entitled "Transfer of Small & Medium Enterprises in the EU and Japan", with speakers from the European Commission, Japanese Organisation of SMEs & Regional Innovation (SMRJ), and the French Ministry of Economy, Industry and Employment.

Presentations showed that the situation was very similar in the EU and Japan, with one third of all enterprises in the EU and almost half of SMEs in Japan expected to face the succession issue in the next 10 years, and that a number of common policies are being set up.



VULCANUS PROGRAMME INSIGHTS



The "Vulcanus in Japan" 1-year company internship programme including 4 months of intensive Japanese language course for European science, engineering and architecture students, has entered its 13th year and hosted 280 students. 56 alumni out of 280 have gone back to Japan for a job or study. Some others have also got a position at a Japanese company in the EU or a Japan-related position in a company.

As part of 4 months study of the Japanese language and culture in the "Vulcanus in Japan" 2008 programme, 33 students took part in a 3-day Homestay & Cultural experience programme. Like last year the host place was Shimane Prefecture, where Japanese history and culture have deep roots with a richly historical landscape. Students deepened their understanding of Japan by regional cultural site visits and by

discovering Japanese ways of living at home and Japanese ways of thinking. Students also participated at one of the most important annual Shinto rituals, an authentic tradition organised by Izumo Shrine. They made a great contribution to grassroots exchanges through this programme, which will help them to become a future "bridge" for the development of industrial cooperation between Japan and the EU.

The 2008 participants began mainly R&D or production work at 24 host companies in January this year. During their stay in Japan they also acquire general knowledge about Japanese business practices, interpersonal communication and culture.

7th European Business Summit

Dare and Care: sustaining Europe's ambitions; Financing, Staffing and Greening

26 & 27 March 2009 at TOUR & TAXIS - Brussels, Belgium

The European Business Summit (EBS) was organised by BUSINESSEUROPE and the Federation of Enterprises in Belgium, in close cooperation with the European Commission and the Czech EU Presidency. After six editions the EBS has truly become Europe's number one dialogue between business leaders and policy makers.

With the theme "Dare and Care: sustaining Europe's ambitions; Financing, Staffing and Greening", EBS wanted to focus on the fact that Europe should dare and care better in order to sustain its ambitions to be a strong world player – especially in times of economic crisis. Daring means that Europe needs to become more entrepreneurial. Doing business in the EU must become easier and more rewarding. Europe should take the lead in R&D and (eco)innovation. More growth and jobs should no longer be a slogan, but a practice.

In Brief

Taoiseach-led Trade Mission to Japan 12–16 January 2009 - Tokyo and Osaka

Ireland's Prime Minister, Taoiseach Brian Cowen, visited Japan in January on the first ever Taoiseach-led trade mission to Japan. He was accompanied by Minister for Agriculture and Food, Brendan Smith, Minister for Trade & Commerce, John McGuinness, and senior management from 70 Irish companies. The objective of the mission was to establish stronger trading links between Japan and Ireland by highlighting the innovative nature of Irish companies to Japanese industry and drawing attention to the significant opportunities in the Japanese market to Irish business. It is hoped that the €46 million in new business announced will be just the beginning of a growing, mutually beneficial business relationship between the two countries. The mission also included a group of companies which spent the week studying best practice in manufacturing in Japan.

Economic cooperation intensifies between Latvia and Japan

During his working visit to Japan from 23-27 January, Latvian Prime Minister Ivars Godmanis met with high-ranking officials of Japanese government, representatives of the European Business Council in Japan, the International Friendship Exchange Council and JTB Corporation. The main subject for the talks was economic cooperation, trade, investment and tourism promotion between Latvia and Japan. Latvia is already exporting to Japan construction lumber, pharmaceutical substances, medical and scientific equipment, fashion items, and food products. Despite the present economic situation, there is strong potential seen in such areas as logistic services, investments and tourism.

In 2008 three large Japanese logistic companies confirmed their interest to utilise the infrastructure of Latvian ports and railways for efficient delivery of goods to the Russia & CIS markets.

OEM (original equipment manufacture) production in Latvia in the textile industry for targeting the EU market is considered as another area of potential growth in cooperation with Japanese international manufacturers.

There are ongoing talks between interested parties in Latvia and Japan concerning the charter flights that would connect Latvia and Japan and transport more Japanese tourists to the Baltic States.

Apart from that, in 2008 three IT companies from Latvia established their presence in Japan:

TiVi.com is offering mobile video streamlining applications. **SIA Zabbix** concluded an authorised partnership agreement with NTT ComTechnology for open-source network management system Zabicom distribution in the Japanese market.

Real Sound Lab opened an office in Japan for promotion of the world's first acoustic-power equaliser technology CONEQ.

From 25-29 January 2009 a Bulgarian official delegation visited Japan on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the re-establishment of diplomatic relations between the two countries. Several political, business and cultural events were organised during the visit. The Bulgarian business delegation, headed by Mr. Georgi Stoev, participated in the economic forum and held the 21st session of the joint Bulgarian-Japanese Economic Council. The session was attended by representatives of Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi UFJ, Ltd., Kawasaki Kisen, Nippon Yusen (NYK Line), Mitsui&Co. Ltd., Itochu Corp., Yazaki Corp., Yamamoto Perfumery Mitsubishi Corp., Yokushukai, Iwata Chizaki Inc., Meiji Diaries Corp., Marubeni Corp., Pemnta - Ocean Construction, Japan Carbon Finance and by government representatives from MOFA, METI and JICA. On 1 March 2009 the Agreement between the Kingdom of the Netherlands and Japan on social security came into force. This means a major change in the applicable legislation (on social security) for Japanese employees in the Netherlands. As from the moment of entry into force of the Agreement, Japanese workers who are posted in the Netherlands do not have an obligation to be insured in the Netherlands for social security anymore.

To be posted in the Netherlands, these workers will have to present themselves at the Japanese Competent Institution in Japan (it may also be possible that the employer will take action on this matter). Further information on this can be provided by the competent social security institutions in Japan.

The direct consequence of not being insured in the Netherlands is that Japanese employers no longer have to pay social security contributions for the Dutch obligatory insurance schemes.

As a direct consequence for Japanese employees in the Netherlands, there is no more entitlement to Dutch child allowances and social security benefits; nor do Japanese employees have to have compulsory insurance anymore in the Netherlands for sickness and health.

Created in 1997, the Spain-Japan Forum acts as a meeting of public authorities and civil society organisations of both countries with the primary aim of promoting bilateral relations in political, economic and cultural areas.
